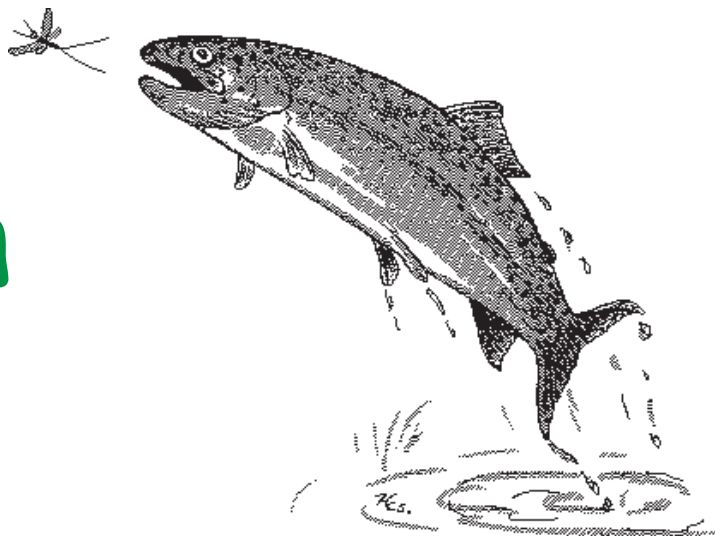

Matthew DeLullo, founder of Project A.N.G.E.L., came to the board meeting to introduce his organization and to seek volunteer help from ETU. Matthew's project provides opportunities for kids with life threatening or debilitating diseases to participate in various types of sporting events (including fishing) and to experience nature. Having recently lost access to a pond near Longmont where his organization hosted bass fishing days for the kids, he is searching for new venues and new volunteers to keep his fishing event going.

The youth education program at Mt. Evans Outdoor Lab is gearing up for the new academic year. Len Wheaton already has scheduled two fly tying classes in September (6th and 26th). Over the summer, the Lab hosted a picnic for the ETU fly tying volunteers and their families. About a dozen folks attended and had a great time.

### Volunteers Needed For Fish Count

**T**he CDOW has asked ETU for volunteers to help with their annual fish count -- electrofishing -- on Bear Creek, later this month.

Electrofishing involves injecting an electrical current into a certain reach of the stream and then using hand-held probes to locate the fish. The trout are just slightly stunned, allowing them to be gathered, measured, weighed and then released unharmed.

Volunteers assist DOW in several ways, from the measuring and weighing process to probing the streams with 'the wands.' The data comprise an integral piece of ETU's efforts to study and improve Bear Creek.

Seven sections of Bear Creek will be sampled: Morrison Park, Lair O' the Bear Open Space, Idledale, O'Fallon Park, Bear Creek Cabins, downtown Evergreen and upstream of the Evergreen Golf Course.

Volunteers are needed for an all-day commitment on Monday, September 25th, and for a half-day (noon to 5:00p) on Wednesday, September 27th. You need to bring waders and clothing to keep you warm from being in the stream for several hours. DOW suggests neoprenes if you have them because of the electrical charges being used. They are not necessary, however.

### CTU Secures \$230K Restoration Grant

**T**he Colorado Division of Wildlife recently announced its 2006 "Fishing is Fun" grant awards, and CTU was approved for a grant of approximately \$230,000 towards the Buffalo Peaks Ranch Project on the Middle Fork of the South Platte River. The grant provides a majority of the funds needed to complete Phase I of the project, though CTU will need to raise more than \$75,000 more in cash and in-kind contributions as a condition of the Fishing is Fun grant.

The Buffalo Peaks Ranch project is an effort by CTU and its chapters to restore fish habitat on a four-mile segment of public water along the Middle Fork South Platte River in Park County -- just upstream from the Tomahawk State Wildlife Area. The stream has been damaged by historic grazing, and the project will help restore a more natural channel condition, provide more pools and structure for fish habitat, and protect riparian habitat through fencing to manage grazing use on the property. After restoration, the combined reaches at Buffalo Peaks and Tomahawk will offer one of the best continuous reaches of public angling

in the region.

CTU is working on this project with Ecological Resource Consultants, whose past major river restoration efforts have included the Blue River, Fraser River, and Bear Creek restoration projects. Channel modification and placement of major habitat features will be conducted by contractors using heavy equipment; volunteers will be able to assist with other project efforts including fencing and revegetation along the riparian corridor. Project manager (and CTU Secretary) Sinjin Eberle has done an outstanding job of building partnerships and securing support for the project. Of the Fishing Is Fun grant, he said, "This award is a fantastic boost for the project and an enormous show of support for the project by the DOW. They should be thanked at every opportunity."

### Great Colorado Rivers Cleanup

**T**he Great Colorado Rivers Cleanup is a joint project of CTU and its chapters throughout Colorado, where volunteers help pick up trash along local rivers. Volunteers meet in the morning, get their instructions and trash bags, and spread out along their local river to help pick up a summer's worth of trash that has accumulated streamside. All volunteers get a Great Colorado Rivers Cleanup t-shirt as a small thank-you for their help. This is a great one-day project for volunteers and families, and it helps CTU put rivers and conservation in front of a statewide audience. The 2006 event is schedule for September 16th, though dates on specific rivers vary based on local circumstances. All together, TU Volunteers will help at 15 river cleanups around the state. Cleanups scheduled for 2006 include:

September 9th - Roaring Fork River (Ferdinand Hayden Chapter)

September 16th - Animas River (Five Rivers Chapter), Arkansas River (Collegiate Peaks Chapter), Big Thompson (Alpine Anglers Chapter), Boulder Creek (Boulder Flycasters Chapter), Cache la Poudre (Rocky Mountain Flycasters Chapter), St. Vrain River (St. Vrain Anglers Chapter), Uncompaghre River (Gunnison Gorge Chapter), Clear Creek above Golden (Cherry Creek, Cutthroat, and West Denver Chapters), Colorado River - below Shadow Mountain Dam (Colorado Headwaters Chapter), South Platte - Elevenmile Canyon (Cheyenne Mountain Chapter)

September 30th - South Platte River in Denver (Denver Chapter, through partnership with The Greenway Foundation), Bear Creek (Evergreen Chapter)

October 14th - Blue River (Gore Range Chapter, with Summit County Make A Difference Day), West Creek (Grand Valley Anglers Chapter)
